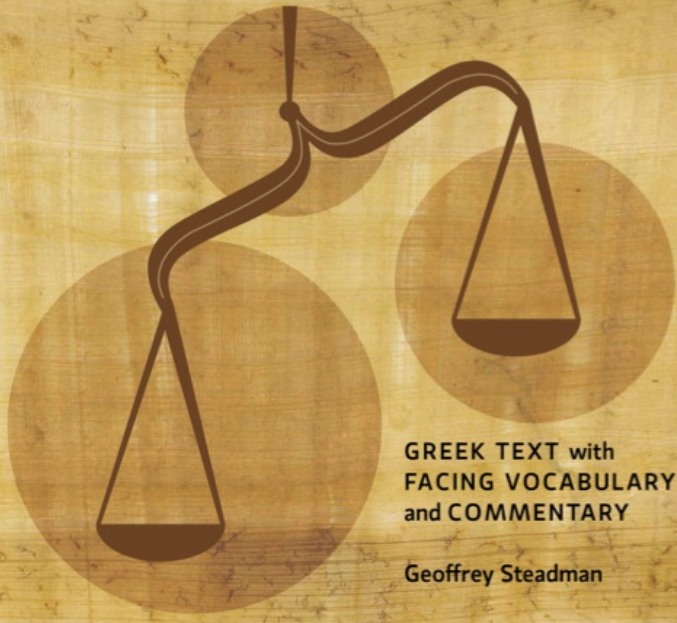

Below is a running vocabulary list of words in the *Crito* that are also high frequency words in classical Greek literature. The original high frequency list of 529 words, which account for 70% of the words in an average classical Greek text, was compiled by Wilfred Major (Louisiana State U.) and Anne Mahoney (Tufts U.) and is found at dcc.dickinson.edu. The number in the lower left corner corresponds to the page in the commentary where the Greek word first occurs.
